# THE MENTAL HEALTH FORUM in the Southern Health & Social Care Trust

## **Terms of Reference**

#### 1.0 Context

The Mental Health Forum is an independent organisation registered with the Charity Commission for Northern Ireland (NIC104166) It was established in 1993 as a means of communicating mental health service user opinion and seeking to improve the quality and delivery of mental health services.

#### 2.0 Name

The organisation is known as The Mental Health Forum (or 'The Forum')

## 3.0 The Purpose

The Forum will provide opportunities for service users to come together on a regular basis to learn about and discuss developments within mental health in a safe, non-judgemental environment, and where their views are represented by service users and/or their representatives to statutory providers and other relevant agencies. The Forum will focus on the individual's right to build a meaningful life for themselves and to be supported in doing so.

# 4.0 Objectives

The Forum's key objectives shall be:

- Representing service users views and opinions
- Collaborative engagement with Trust and influencing decision making
- Information / Connecting people to services / Support
- ❖ Social Interaction and Integration Connecting with others
- Sharing experiences and identifying common concerns
- Encouraging and supporting individuals in taking responsibility
- Focusing on individual strengths, abilities and possibilities
- Reducing stigma
- Encouraging active participation in a range of opportunities
- Education
- Fundraising
- Developing opportunities for volunteering
- Growing and strengthening the service user voice by recruitment of new members

## 5.0 Membership

Membership is open to all users of mental health services aged 18yrs + in the Southern Trust area.

## 6.0 Co-options

Others may be invited to attend at the request of the Forum to speak about specific agenda items.

#### 7.0 Roles

Forum meetings shall be facilitated by the Manager, supported by

- Forum Secretary
- CPN at Trasna House (Advisory Position)

#### 8.0 Quorum

The quorum for each meeting shall be a minimum of two service users and one facilitator from the above nominated roles.

# 9.0 Frequency of Meetings

- Member Meetings will be held monthly at Trasna House, Lurgan – First Monday each month 6.30 – 8.30pm
- Social Group Meetings will be held as set by the group itself In Trasna House or in a social/community setting of choice
- Business Group Meeting to discuss and support specific co-production activity with be held at least bi-monthly at Trasna House, Lurgan according to mutually agreed dates and times
- ❖ The Forum Annual General Meeting and other dedicated Information
- Sharing or Consultation meetings will be held as required subject to notification

# **10 Reporting Arrangements**

- All issues and matters of importance and concern will be escalated to the monthly UCSIG (User & Carer Service Improvement Group) meetings for discussion, recording and onward referral. (UCSIG sits at the heart of service planning and provision via Trust workstreams and feeds the two-way conduit between Divisional management and service user & carer communities)
- ❖ All relevant information from statutory providers and other relevant sources will be disseminated to members on a monthly basis through the feedback of Forum representatives at UCSIG and all other Trust & Regional engagement and advisory bodies.
